Overview

Ever wondered if prison really does change criminal behaviour? Or why some people conform? Or perhaps if the experiences you had before the age of five really do shape the person you are today? A-level Psychology will give you an understanding of the way people think and why people behave in certain ways.

In your first year, you will study topics that cover the introductory topics of Psychology and Psychology in context; these include: Social Influence, Memory, Biopsychology, Psychopathology and Research Methods.

Your second year will look at Research Methods again, as well as further examples of Psychology in context and issues/debates in Psychology; these include: Stress, Relationships and Forensic Psychology.
