### Examination results

### First day back

The first day back for students is **Thursday, 5th September, starting at 8:30 a.m.** We'll jump straight into the new college year with no time wasted. There will be a brief welcome assembly led by the pastoral team, followed by tutor group inductions during Period 1. Students will then begin their curriculum lessons in Period 2.



### Being prepared for September

To be prepared for the start of term, it's essential to get organised early. Please ensure students have all the necessary supplies, such as notebooks, stationery, and any textbooks required for your courses. Lastly, encourage students to approach the new term with a positive mindset and clear goals, ready to make the most of this important stage in their education.



### Daily Attendance

Students who perform well in their exams all had one thing in common - good attendance. It is crucial that students are in college every day; every missed lesson means missing vital learning. Developing good habits and strong routines of attending college daily is essential. Please contact the year team if there is anything we can do to support you in ensuring your daughter/son has good attendance.



I sincerely hope that our students can aim for 100% attendance this academic year, and your support in achieving this is greatly appreciated.

### Part time work

Part-time work can provide income to support students' studies and help them gain more independence. For these reasons, we encourage your child to seek a part-time job, as it offers valuable experience.



However, it should not interfere with college work, i.e. it should not take place during college hours, and we recommend no more than 8 hours per week.

Please note the following research: Sixth formers whose part-time jobs take up more than 8 hours a week are risking the grades they need for university and apprenticeships. Research shows that teenagers working up to 7 or 8 hours a week may marginally improve their predicted Level 3 performance. However, results suffer when hours exceed this. Those working 15+ hours are scoring, on average, 36 UCAS points below their potential (equivalent to dropping from BBB to CCD).

Please consider how this can impact their future progression plans.

### Independent learning

As a Year 13 student, your daughter/son is given much greater responsibility and freedom. During a typical working day, provided they are not in any timetabled lessons or required to complete specific work, they are free to leave the site. However, as your daughter/son transitions into the start of their Level 3 studies, it's crucial to emphasise the importance of using their independent time productively. This period is a pivotal stage in their academic journey, where effective time management and self-discipline can make a significant difference. Encouraging them to prioritise their studies, set clear goals, and maintain a structured routine will not only enhance their learning but also prepare them for future challenges. Your support in fostering these habits will be invaluable as they work towards achieving their academic aspirations.

### Class Charts

Parents continue to inform us that they benefit from the Class Charts app, as it has given them daily information to help them understand how their daughter/son is performing. We will continue to use Class Charts for letters, homework, attendance, rewards and behaviour. Please ensure you have your logon details and the App, so you can see 'live' information each day.

### Extracurricular clubs and activities

Last year was truly incredible with what the students were offered. This included everything from the college musicals, sports, clubs, residential and international trips to France, Germany and China. We are looking forward to embellishing the extracurricular offering for Post 16 students. I encourage all students to get involved in as many extracurricular activities as possible and immerse themselves into Cowley Sixth Form life as there are countless benefits to this, including showcasing student development within progression applications for higher education and future employment.

There will be a Post 16 Enrichment Fair taking place **13<sup>th</sup> September at lunch time in Cowley Hall**. More information will be shared to students in September about these activities.

As a college, we are in receipt of funding that can be distributed to 16 – 19 students who meet certain eligibility criteria based on household income.
