protect your home or car



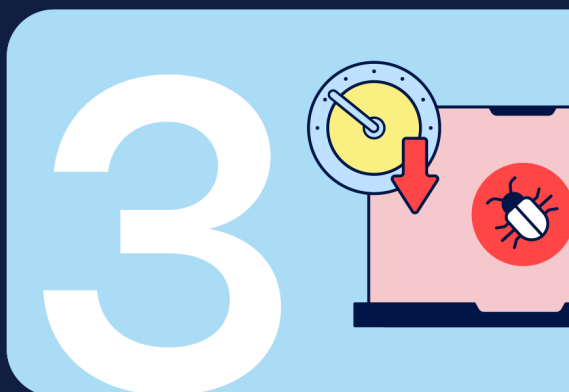
Keep valuables out of sight

- ✓ Hide your passwords in a password manager

Lock your doors
